General behaviour

- 1 A participant shall at all times act in the best interests of the game, and shall not act in any manner which is improper or brings the game into disrepute.
- 2 A participant shall not use any one, or combination of the following
Violent, threatening, abusive, indecent, or insulting words or behaviour.

In view of this, the Club, being a Charter Standard Club, requests all Club members, and officials to abide, and act, by these aims, to ensure that the reputation, and decorum of the Club will be enhanced, and improved, to all it comes in contact with throughout Club business.

Children develop differently and at different rates; they react differently to the same pressures. Youngsters should be involved in football for their own personnel enjoyment. This then, in turn, will give every one around them their enjoyment. They should, at all times, be positively encouraged.

Considering these views, we ask that all who support the club and the teams should act accordingly to the following guidelines:

Community

Football, at all levels, is a vital part of our community.

Observe it.

Equality

The Club is opposed to all forms of discrimination, and bullying, it will actively promote measures to prevent it from being expressed.

Esteem it.

Young People

The Club acknowledges their extent of its influences over young people and will work together so we can set an example for them by our positive actions and behaviour.

Revere it.

Trust and Respect

The Club will uphold and foster a relationship of trust and respect that exist between all involved within the game.

Value it.

Violence

The Club will totally reject the use or expression of violence, of any nature, by anyone involved within football.

Abhor it.

Integrity and Fair Play

The Club is committed to the principle of playing to win is consistent with the belief of integrity and fair play in all our dealings with all involved within the game.

Honour it.

To help portray the Club in a good light we ask you to follow these simple rules;

- Play the game by the rules for the enjoyment of all.
- Never shout abusive or use offensive language at anyone.
- Never openly, and publicly question the judgement of a match official.
- Recognise the value of the effort the individual puts in to help us all enjoy the game.
- Encourage all to play for the enjoyment of all and discourage unsportsmanlike behaviour
- Never ridicule anyone for making a mistake; encouragement removes the fear of making mistakes.
